

\*\*\*IMPORTANT SNOW EMERGENCY INFORMATION\*\*\*

**Snow Emergency:** Depending upon the amount of snow that is forecasted or accumulates, the Mayor of Elizabethville may declare a Snow Emergency. The Borough Snow Emergency Ordinance prohibits parking on Snow Emergency Routes when A Snow Emergency is declared. Vehicles that are parked on the street during a snow emergency are subject to a citation.

*The following streets are designated as Snow Emergency Routes*

Main Street (U.S. Route 209)	Entire length of the Borough
Market Street (PA. Route 225)	Entire length of the Borough

The Borough Maintenance Department makes every attempt to have the Borough streets and roads plowed and/or salted whenever an accumulation of snow occurs. To help us accomplish this task in a timely manner and not to put our staff at risk, we ask that when snow is forecast and/or when snow is falling, you remove any vehicles from the road or street.

Announcements of Snow Emergency will be broadcast on radio and television stations. These include WHTM-TV Channel 27, WHP-TV Channel 21, WPMT Fox-TV Channel 43, Comcast Public Channel 18 and the following radio stations WYGL –FM (100.5 Big Country), WQLV-FM (98.9 LOVE),. **Driveways:** Snow from driveways and sidewalks is not to be shoveled, plowed, blown or thrown into the street or road. This can cause dangerous driving conditions for your fellow residents and Borough Maintenance Employees.

**Sidewalks:** If sidewalks or walkways exist in front of your residence, you are responsible for removing the snow from the sidewalks/walkways within 12 hours of snowfall.

**Fire Hydrants:** Should a Fire Hydrant be located in front of your residence, you are responsible for clearing the snow from around the Fire Hydrant within 12 hours of snowfall. Failure to do so may result in the Fire Department being unable to locate and connect to the hydrant in the event of a fire or delay this process, placing your property or your neighbor's property at greater risk if a fire should occur.

**Mailboxes:** Please remember to clear the area around your mailbox. The Post Office may be unable to deliver your mail if they cannot access your mailbox.
