The Elizabethville Borough Council met December 12, 2022 at Elizabethville Borough Building 68 South Moore Street, Elizabethville Pa 17023. President Kenneth Strine called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Strine recognized Mattea Zimmerman, a resident of Elizabethville. Mattea addressed Council to consider options for the traffic signal on Market St. and Rt 209. Mattea stated that there are instruments that can be installed on this traffic signal to assist with sight deficiency. They are as follows: LPI- Leading Pedestrian Interval and APS- Audible Pedestrian Signal. Council informed Mattea that this is something the Borough will look into to get the requirements from State and also costs.

Peer Grant

• Gives us a consultant from DCNR's recommendation, public input process, site drawing, and cost estimates. Could potentially get

- I contacted Alfred Benesch to see if they had any suggestions or insight for us and spoke with David Miller. He referred me to Dan Cook, senior project engineer, I spoke with him today.
- Dan Cook looked into the Peer Grant application process. He said that for the information we would get and for the cost we would put out for it, he felt that it was a worthwhile process. If we had Alfred and Benesch apply for the grant for us it would cost approximately \$950.
- Dan Cook thinks there is a chance that <u>Alfred and Benesch</u> (Alfred Benesch) are on the list of consultants, if this is the case, it's possible we could have them as our consultant for the peer grant process. He is checking into that.
- If we choose to not do the peer grant, I asked him if <u>Alfred and Benesch</u> (Alfred Benesch) could essentially do the same thing for us and he said yes, it would probably cost somewhere between \$10,000.\$18,000. We could potentially use the tourism grant money to help cover the cost of this if we went this direction.
- A pro for some of you might be that it eliminates any DCNR restrictions, however, he would still be bound to make recommendations that comply with ADA and American Safety guidelines.
- He would be willing to come to our meeting in January and speak with the council if that is something we are interested in. His hourly rate is around \$135. He lives about an hour away. I can get more information if this is the direction we would like to move in.
- Sidenote: When I spoke with David Miller, I asked him if our conversation on the phone cost us anything and he said no. However, I did not realize that when I spoke with Dan Cook today, he was charging me for his information and advice.
- At this point we have two directions we could move in. I know we all have some concerns with unknowns concerning DCNR, so if we would go with <u>Alfred and Benesch</u> (Alfred Benesch) in creating a plan for the park we could show them Jamie's plan as one option we are looking into and get some other information and options from them.
